

LIFE BIOGRAPHY



Pablo De Leon (born Pablo Contreras) was born on July 15, 1974, in Ciudad, Mier, Tamaulipas, Mexico, to Ines Maria Contreras and Pablo Yepes Contreras. The family moved to Fairfield, Texas, when Pablo was 4 years old.

Early in his life, Pablo discovered his first love: baseball. Showing natural athletic aptitude from the time he was a child, he continued to practice and play in school, eventually receiving a baseball scholarship to Calhoun Community College in Alabama. After playing college ball in Alabama and Texas, Pablo received attention from professional teams and was recruited by the Minor League Harlingen White Wings. Thanks to his love for the game and the athletic skills developed over his lifetime, he contributed to the team's victory at the championship series of the Texas/Louisiana league during his rookie year.

This win catapulted Pablo to success not only as an athlete but also as a motivational speaker. When he had the opportunity to speak publicly about his success in baseball, he realized how his story could inspire others to pursue their own success. Inspired, he wrote his first book, "The Hell With Love: A Struggle on a Journey to Find Real Love." The book enjoyed popularity among his fans and even inspired his five younger siblings. He followed this up with "Limitless," a guide to overcoming obstacles and

creating a successful life in spite of negative circumstances. Eventually, being in the public eye as an athlete, author and speaker rekindled Pablo's childhood interest in acting. Driven by his success in his other initiatives, Pablo pursued acting head on and his determination quickly earned him roles on TV shows and independent films. Pablo made his screen debut in Fox's "The Good Guys" in 2011, and then landed roles on NBC's "Chase" and "Friday Night Lights." After both starring and acting as associate producer in the independent short "The Ugly," Pablo landed a starring role as hired hitman Roma in "Crossing the Enemy," his first full-length film. He decided to continue producing and went on to do double duty as actor and producer in "It's Complicated" from Grind Over Matter Films and "Wrong Girl."

On top of continuing to work on and off camera, Pablo continues traveling as a motivational speaker and is also pursuing his goal to run a successful business. A firm believer in the power of honesty, philanthropy and loyalty, Pablo is involved in several charities to help others learn some of the most important lessons life has taught him: to never stop learning and developing his skills.

As a highly sought-after motivational speaker, Pablo uses his influence to make a positive impact in others' lives around the world and believes in giving back to his local community. A regular attendee of the Eva's Heroes Baseball Clinic, Eva's Heroes celebrity casino night, San Antonio Stars Gala and Charity Ball, Pablo focuses on helping the less fortunate overcome difficult circumstances, including those in his native country of Mexico. In 2007, he teamed up with Hope for the Sole to help raise more than \$10,000 for children in Juarez, Mexico. In addition, Pablo works

with Avant Ministries to provide disenfranchised families with housing appliances. The cause closest to Pablo's heart is creating opportunities for young people to improve themselves through education. He believes all people should have the chance to reach their goals and has personally funded scholarships to those pursuing higher education.



FUN FACT:




FUN FACT:
