FADE IN:

EXT. MIDWAY ATOLL - DAY

SUPER: "JUNE 4, 1942"

SFX: AIR RAID SIREN WAILING

A squadron of Japanese Planes <u>attack on Midway Atoll with tracer</u> rounds and dive bombing on the airfield. AMERICAN PILOT, JAMES S. GRAY, attempt to escape Midway Atoll along with OTHER AMERICAN PILOTS.

JAMES S. GRAY

Everyone, to the fighters! Now!

James S. Gray starts his engine on the F4F Wildcat. The Wildcat fighters took off from the burning airfield.

INT. JEFFY'S WILDCAT - DAY

JEFFY

(on radio) James, this is Jeffy.
Is everyone airborne?

INT. JAMES S. GRAY'S WILDCAT - DAY

JAMES S. GRAY

(on radio) They're too many Japs at Midway. Hold them off so we can meet up with the Thompson Brothers.

INT. JEFFY'S WILDCAT - DAY

JEFFY

(on radio) Roger. Let's hope the
Japs won't follow us to the
Carrier.

The American Wildcats are <u>dogfighting with the Japanese Zeros</u>, but some are <u>intercepting the Japanese dive bombers with .50</u> <u>caliber machine guns</u>. Several American pilots are shot down by the Japanese Zeros, while the remaining Wildcat fighters escape from the carnage. On their way to the Carrier, Jeffy spots the Japanese Zero in front of him.

JEFFY (CONT'D)

The Zero is heading for the Carrier. Got to take him out!

INT. JAMES S. GRAY'S WILDCAT - DAY

James S. Gray was stunned as Jeffy purses the Japanese Zero with climbing speed.

JAMES S. GRAY

(yells over the radio) Jeffy, get back in formation!

INT. JEFFY'S WILDCAT - DAY

JEFFY

(on radio) Negative, James! I
can't let the Zero get away!

Jeffy wasn't listening to James. Using the stock footage from Dogfights: Season 1 episode, The Zero Killer, he continues to climb over 20,000 feet.

INT. JAMES S. GRAY'S WILDCAT - DAY

JAMES S. GRAY

(on radio) That's enough, Jeffy!
Get to the Carrier, now!

INT. JEFFY'S WILDCAT - DAY

JEFFY

Not until I get my first kill.

INT. JAMES S. GRAY'S WILDCAT - DAY

JAMES S. GRAY

(shouting over the radio) Jeffy! You're stalling out!

But Jeffy stalls out making an easy prey for the Japanese Zero. To his horror, the Japanese Zero <u>fires at Jeffy with diving</u> speed attack. The Japanese tracer fire cuts the Wildcat's wing <u>off.</u> Jeffy is never seen again.

CUT TO:

TITLE EPISODE: MIDWAY

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. USS ENTERPRISE - CAPTAIN'S BRIDGE - DAY

Onboard the *USS Enterprise*, REAR ADMIRAL RAYMOND A. SPRUANCE leads Task Force 16. He's talking to CAPTAIN GEORGE D. MURRAY about the status report at the Coral Sea and Admiral Halsey's illness.

GEORGE D. MURRAY

Admiral Spruance, how was Admiral Halsey doing?

RAYMOND A. SPRUANCE

Halsey suffered from psoriasis, so Admiral Nimitz sent me to take his place until he recuperates.

GEORGE D. MURRAY

We have a report from Rear Admiral Fletcher at the Coral Sea. It appears that Yorktown's flight deck was damaged by the Japanese dive bombers, but however, she's back in action at Midway.

RAYMOND A. SPRUANCE

What about the reinforcements at Midway Atoll?

GEORGE D. MURRAY

Lieutenant Gray and six Wildcats made it back to our Carrier.

RAYMOND A. SPRUANCE

Captain Murray, see you can find the rest of the surviving pilots.

GEORGE D. MURRAY

Yes, sir.

Captain Murray left the bridge to check on the surviving pilots from the Japanese attack at Midway Atoll.

EXT. USS ENTERPRISE - FLIGHT DECK - DAY

Seven remaining Wildcats land on the *USS Enterprise's* flight deck. James exits from his Wildcat fighter.

JOHN THOMPSON

What happened, James?

JAMES S. GRAY

It's Pearl Harbor attack all over again.

BEN THOMPSON

Oh no! Not the Japanese air strike again!

JAMES S. GRAY

But we managed to survive, but Jeffy is the only pilot who died in the aerial combat at Midway Atoll.

BEN THOMPSON

I'm sorry to hear about that,
James.

JAMES S. GRAY

At least we know where the Jap Carriers are.

JOHN THOMPSON

Really? How many?

JAMES S. GRAY

There were six Carriers that attacked Pearl Harbor last year, but now there are four of them at Midway.

BEN THOMPSON

Four Jap Carriers? At Midway?

JOHN THOMPSON

We didn't see the other two carriers at the Coral Sea last month.

JAMES S. GRAY

It's OK, you two. At least we're going to make the Japs pay for what they've did to us at Pearl Harbor back then.

BEN THOMPSON

And that's exactly what we're going to do!

JOHN THOMPSON

I agree with my brother. It's going to be 3-on-4 at Midway.

GEORGE D. MURRAY

Sorry to interrupt you, but we have received a message from Admiral Halsey.

JAMES S. GRAY

What message?

GEORGE D. MURRAY

He's diagnosed with psoriasis.

BEN THOMPSON

What?

JOHN THOMPSON

But we didn't get a chance to see some action at Coral Sea last month!

GEORGE D. MURRAY

And that's why Admiral Spruance oversees Task Force 16. But we're lucky that *Yorktown* is back in action.

JAMES S. GRAY

How can we deal with four Jap Carriers?

GEORGE D. MURRAY

The PBYs are locating the carriers. You must wait until the time is right.

INT. PBY - DAY

Stock footage shows a lone PBY patrolling the Pacific for ariel reconnaissance to locate the enemy carriers.

PBY PILOT

PILOT TO NAVIGATOR, any signs of the Carriers?

PBY NAVIGATOR

Navigator to Pilot, we spotted four enemy carriers. I repeat, four enemy carriers.

PBY PILOT

Radioman, send a message to the fleet.

The Radioman nods his head for saying "yes." The PBY flies off away from the Japanese Fleet.

INT. IJN AKAGI - CAPTAIN BRIDGE - DAY

Onboard the Japanese Carrier, Akagi, JAPANESE CAPTAIN TAIJIRO AOKI receives a message from Admiral Yamamoto.

TAIJIRO AOKI

(speaking in Japanese) Admiral Nagumo, we have a message from Admiral Yamamoto. He said you have directly violated his orders to attack Midway.

CHUICHI NAGUMO

(speaking in Japanese) What?! How did he know that I directly violated Yamamoto's orders for attacking Midway?

TAIJIRO AOKI

(speaking in Japanese) It's the same thing that you and Yamamoto did since Pearl Harbor. As a result, none of the carriers were present because we've woken the sleeping giant last year.

CHUICHI NAGUMO

(speaking in Japanese) And now we must deal with the Carriers. Send our squadron to seek out and destroy the carriers.

TAIJIRO AOKI

(speaking in Japanese) Yes, sir.

INT. USS ENTERPRISE - READY ROOM - DAY

Admiral Spruance gives the Naval Pilots for today's briefing.

RAYMOND A. SPRUANCE

One of our PBYs spotted four carriers, and the Japs are after our carriers.

JOHN THOMPSON

You didn't notice that we fight the Jap planes at Pearl Harbor last year?

BEN THOMPSON

We only took out Zeros in a dogfight to save Pearl Harbor.

JOHN THOMPSON

Then this should be different when we deal with the Japs at Midway.

RAYMOND A. SPRUANCE

Your mission is to sink four enemy carriers before the Japanese can attack us again. LIEUTENANT COMMANDER WADE MCCLUSKY will be your flight leader with Enterprise Air Group. LINDSEY, you'll lead the TBDs to attack the enemy Carriers. LIEUTENANTS BEST AND GALLAHER, you two will lead the SBDs for dive-bombing run on the Carriers in case the Torpedo Squadron fails. And Lieutenant Gray, I want you and the Thompson Brothers to defend our Carriers from incoming enemy bombers.

BEN THOMPSON

Wait! Are you saying the Japs are after our carriers?

RAYMOND A. SPRUANCE

That's their goal, Ben, and your goal is to intercept the bombers before they reach our Carriers. And remember, you and your brother must work together as a team, the same way that you two did last year at Pearl Harbor.

JOHN THOMPSON

Well, I guess we have no choice but to defend the carriers.

JAMES S. GRAY

Come on, you two. We have a mission to defend.

James and the Thompson Brothers left the ready room along with the rest of the American pilots.

EXT. USS ENTERPRISE - FLIGHT DECK - DAY

The Americans climb to their planes. The *Enterprise* consists of 27 F4F Wildcats, 38 SBD Dauntless dive-bombers, and 14 TBD Devastators. The *Enterprise* Air Group took off from the carrier to sink the Japanese Carriers at Midway.

INT. IJN AKAGI - CAPTAIN BRIDGE - DAY

ONE OF THE JAPANESE OFFICERS warns Vice Admiral Nagumo at the bridge for incoming aircraft.

JAPANESE OFFICER

(speaking in Japanese) Sir, enemy aircraft are approaching! They're coming from Midway.

Admiral Nagumo spots a squadron of B-26 Marauders and obsolete planes by using binoculars. The B-26s carry torpedoes to sink the Japanese Carriers.

CHUCHI NAGUMO

(speaking in Japanese) Order your men to shoot them down!

The Japanese Sailor bows to Vice Admiral Nagumo for an agreement and leaves the bridge.

INT. IJN AKAGI - ANTI-AIRCRAFT STATION - DAY

The Japanese Sailors <u>open fire at the enemy planes with antiaircraft barrage.</u> All the obsolete planes are no match against Akagi's anti-aircraft flak guns, but some release their torpedoes to sink Akagi.

INT/EXT. IJN AKAGI - CAPTAIN'S BRIDGE - DAY

Vice Admiral Nagumo was amazed!

CHUICHI NAGUMO (CONT'D)

(speaking in Japanese) These pilots are no match for our Carrier! Hard to port!

TAIJIRO AOKI

(speaking in Japanese) Yes, Vice Admiral. Hard to port!

Akagi turns hard to port to dodge the torpedoes. The last bomber is shot down by the Japanese flak and plunges into the water.

INT. USS NAUTILUS - CONNING TOWER - DAY

Beneath the ocean depths, the American submarine, *USS Nautilus*, is searching for the Japanese Carriers by using a periscope.

AMERICAN SAILOR

LIEUTENANT COMMANDER BROCKMAN, we've located the Jap Carriers.

WILLIAM H. BROCKMAN JR.

Excellent! Now we know where the Jap carriers are. Target the Carrier with torpedoes.

AMERICAN SAILOR

Yes, sir! (To the American sailors) Release torpedoes!

EXT. USS NAUTILUS - DAY

The Nautilus launches torpedoes at the Japanese carrier-

INT. IJN ARASHI - DAY

-but the *Nautilus* didn't see the Japanese destroyer *Arashi* releasing the depth charges at the American submarine which was stock footage.

INT/EXT. USS NAUTILUS - DAY

The depth charges exploded around *USS Nautilus*. The depth charge explosion rocks the *USS Nautilus*.

WILLIAM H. BROCKMAN JR.

Damage report!

AMERICAN SAILOR

There's no damage, Sir! The depth charges were coming from the Jap destroyer!

WILLIAM H. BROCKMAN JR.

It's Arashi! Get us out of here!

The USS Nautilus steers away from the Japanese depth charges.

INT. TBD DEVASTATOR - DAY

SUPER: "TORPEDO 6 SQUADRON. 9:30 AM."

Lieutenant Commander Eugene E. Lindsey leads a squadron of TBD Devastator Torpedo Bombers to sink the Japanese Carriers. His rear gunner, Grenat, keeps an eye out for incoming Zeros on his tail.

EUGENE E. LINDSEY

(on radio) Grenat, how are you doing out there?

CHARLES T. GRENAT

(on radio) I'm alright, Commander.
Just checking the .50 calibers
loaded.

EUGENE E. LINDSEY

(on radio) Just keep an eye out of the Japanese Zeros while I'll deal with the Jap Carrier.

CHARLES T. GRENAT

(on radio) Bandits! 5 o'clock!

EUGENE E. LINDSEY

(on radio) Zeros! Grenat, shoot them down!

Grenat opens fire at the Zeros with a .50 caliber machine gun on the rear. The Zeros shot down TBDs before reaching their target by using stock footage. One of the Zeros is targeting Lindsey. Grenat aims at the Zero, but the Japanese Zero's 7.7 mm machine gun kills Grenat and finishes off with Lindsey with 20 mm cannons. The stricken TBD plunges into the ocean before reaching the Japanese carrier. Lieutenant Commander Lindsey is dead along with nine TBDs. Not a single American torpedo hits the Japanese Carrier Fleet.

INT. WADE MCCLUSKY'S SBD - DAY

SUPER: "BOMBING SQUADRON 6. 10:25 AM."

At 15,000 feet, Lieutenant Commander Clarence Wade McClusky leads the *Enterprise* Air Group.

CLARENCE WADE MCCLUSKY

(on radio) BOMBING 6, this is Wade
McClusky. Do you copy?

INT. RICHARD BEST'S SBD - DAY

Lieutenant Richard "Dick" Best responds to McClusky over the radio.

RICHARD HALSEY BEST

(on radio) This is Bombing 6, go ahead.

INT. WADE MCCLUSKY'S SBD - DAY

CLARENCE WADE MCCLUSKY

(on radio) Torpedo 6 is out of action, Dick. You're in charge of SBD squadron, but make sure the Japs are not after you and your squadron.

INT. RICHARD BEST'S SBD - DAY

RICHARD HALSEY BEST

(on radio) Then let's take down the Jap carriers and make them pay for hitting us at Pearl Harbor. (to Bombing 6) Bombing 6, split up and dive-bomb on the carriers.

WILMER E. GALLAHER

(on radio) Roger. Heading for the carriers.

The SBDs prepare for a dive-bombing run on the Japanese Carriers.

INT. IJN AKAGI - CAPTAIN'S BRIDGE - DAY

Vice Admiral Nagumo spots the SBDs attacking the Japanese Carriers with binoculars.

CHUCHI NAGUMO

(speaking in Japanese) Those planes aren't ours! They're Americans! Shoot them down!

EXT. IJN KAGA - ANTI-AIRCRAFT STATION - DAY

The stock footage shows <code>Kaga's</code> anti-aircraft guns <code>firing</code> at the <code>SBDs</code> while Gallaher, and four SBDs went after the Japanese Carrier, <code>Kaga</code>. Five bombs <code>made</code> direct hits on <code>Kaga</code>. One bomb <code>hits</code> <code>Kaga's</code> flight deck on the rear where the Japanese planes takeoff and land. Two more bombs <code>hit</code> the elevator, exploding the <code>hangar</code> decks below, and igniting the fuel. <code>Kaga</code> is now a raging inferno.

INT. IJN AKAGI - ANTI-AIRCRAFT STATION - DAY

Lieutenant Commander "Dick" Best and two SBDs went after Admiral Nagumo's flagship, Akagi. He uses his dive brakes to slow the SBD down while diving towards the Japanese Flagship. Two bombs nearly miss their target, but "Dick" Best made a direct hit on Akagi's midship destroying the upper hanger deck and exploding the planes on the flight deck.

INT. MAXWELL'S SBD - DAY

Meanwhile, 18 SBD Dauntless dive-bombers from *USS Yorktown*, led by LIEUTENANT COMMANDER MAXWELL F. LESLIE, are looking for their target.

MAXWELL F. LESLIE

(on radio) BOMBING 3, do you see any Jap carriers?

INT. LEFTY'S SBD - DAY

PAUL HOLMBERG

(on radio) Roger. I see *Soryu* on the left.

INT. HAROLD'S SBD - DAY

HAROLD BOTTOMLY

(on radio laughing) Paul, you're so funny! No wonder they called you "Lefty".

INT. MAXWELL'S SBD - DAY

MAXWELL F. LESLIE

(on radio) Alright, that's enough! It's time to unload the bombs on Soryu.

CLOSE-ON: SBD COCKPIT

Maxwell accidentally jettisons its bombload!

MAXWELL F. LESLIE (CONT'D)

(on radio) Oh shit!

One of the SBDs releases its bomb and disappears.

MAXWELL F. LESLIE (CONT'D)

(on radio) Note to yourself. Don't release your bombloads until we reach Soryu.

INT. WESTON'S SBD - DAY

WESTON

(on radio) I'm aware of that, Leslie.

MAXWELL F. LESLIE (V.O.)

(on radio) Good, lead the Bombing 3. Make sure you hit the target before returning to *Yorktown*. Are we clear?

WESTON

(on radio) Roger, Leslie. It is time to do some damage to Soryu.

Weston and two SBDs make a dive-bombing run on *Soryu. Soryu* was <u>hit three times with 1,000 pounds of bombs</u> by using stock footage.

EXT. IJN HIRYU - FLAG BRIDGE - DAY

Onboard the Japanese Carrier Hiryu, REAR ADMIRAL TAMON YAMAGUCHI leads the $2^{\rm nd}$ Carrier Division who discovers three burning carriers by using his binoculars and \underline{Kaga} was blown up from the distance. CAPTAIN TOMEO KUKU witnesses the carnage.

TOMEO KUKU

(speaking in Japanese) Sir, we've lost three carriers!

TAMON YAMAGUCHI

(speaking in Japanese) Then it's a perfect time to strike at the American Carriers. Send our bomber squadron to attack the American Carriers.

TOMEO KUKU

(speaking in Japanese) Yes, sir.

EXT. IJN HIRYU - FLIGHT DECK - DAY

Using the stock footage, 36 Japanese Bombers launch from *Hiryu* to seek her revenge on the American Carriers.

INT. JAMES' F4F WILDCAT - DAY

SUPER: "FIGHTING SQUADRON 6. 11:30 AM."

At 15,000 feet, James leads the Fighting 6 to protect the American Carriers at all costs.

JAMES S. GRAY

(on radio) Fighting 6, this is Lieutenant Gray speaking. Do you copy?

INT. BEN THOMPSON'S F4F WILDCAT - DAY

BEN THOMPSON

(on radio) Copy, James. John and I are protecting our CAP.

INT. JAMES' F4F WILDCAT - DAY

JAMES S. GRAY

(on radio) Good. Make sure the Japs don't reach our carriers.

INT. JOHN THOMPSON'S F4F WILDCAT - DAY

JOHN THOMPSON

(on radio) Bandits! 12 o'clock!
The Japs are in "V" Shape
formation!

INT. JAMES' F4F WILDCAT - DAY

JAMES S. GRAY

(on radio) Fighting 6, take out the leader, first.

INT. BEN THOMPSON'S F4F WILDCAT - DAY

BEN THOMPSON

(on radio) Roger. Commencing attack.

James and the Wildcats dive towards the Japanese Val divebombers. Using a stock footage from Dogfights: Season 2, .50 caliber bullets struck on Japanese Val, knocking the right stabilizer, killing two Japanese dive-bomber crew, and the propeller stops turning causing the right wing to break loose along with its fixed landing gear and ends up spiraling out of control. Five Japanese Val dive-bombers are shot down by American Wildcat Fighters, but four remaining Japanese dive-bombers attack Yorktown. Note the stock footage of the Japanese Val dive-bombers are painted white. One bomb nearly misses Yorktown, but three bombs struck Yorktown's flight deck, but the damage was minor compared to the Japanese carriers.

INT. JOHN THOMPSON'S WILDCAT - DAY

JOHN THOMPSON

(on radio) Yorktown has been hit!
I repeat, Yorktown has been hit!
There's no way we can save
Yorktown!

INT. BEN THOMPSON'S WILDCAT - DAY

BEN THOMPSON

(on radio) That's not good! We
can't let the Japs get away!

INT. JAMES' WILDCAT - DAY

JAMES S. GRAY

(on radio) Negative, Ben. We've got company. The Japs brought Kate torpedo planes to finish her off.

INT. BEN THOMPSON'S WILDCAT - DAY

BEN THOMPSON

(on radio) Then we have no choice but to stop them before they reach *Yorktown* again.

INT. JOHN THOMPSON'S WILDCAT - DAY

JOHN THOMPSON

(on radio) Roger! We'll cover you!

Stock footage shows five Japanese Kate torpedo bombers heading for the American Fleet.

The Japanese Pilots were surprised the Yorktown was already repaired. The Japanese make a torpedo run on the Yorktown. The Japanese release their torpedoes at the Yorktown. Unlike the Americans, two Japanese torpedoes hit the Yorktown at the port side.

INT. BEN THOMPSON'S WILDCAT - DAY

BEN THOMPSON

(on radio) No! We're too late! The Japs hit Yorktown again!

INT. JOHN THOMPSON'S WILDCAT - DAY

JOHN THOMPSON

(on radio) I had enough of this! Let's teach the Japs a lesson!

INT. JAMES' WILDCAT - DAY

JAMES S. GRAY

(on radio) Ben! John! You two get back in formation, now!

INT. BEN THOMPSON'S WILDCAT - DAY

BEN THOMPSON

(on radio) Negative, James! We're going to make the Japs pay for what they did at Yorktown!

The Thompson Brothers attack the Japanese torpedo planes. All five Kate torpedo planes were shot down by the Thompson Brothers before returning to *USS Enterprise*.

EXT. USS ENTERPRISE - FLIGHT DECK - DAY

The American planes land on USS Enterprise's flight deck.

BEN THOMPSON

Lesile? How did you get here so fast?

MAXWELL F. LESILE

I jettisoned the bomb by accident, Ben.

MAXWELL F. LESILE [CONT'D]

Fortunately, Weston and the other two SBDs scored a direct hit at Soryu. That's why LIEUTENANT DEWITT SHUMWAY, Weston and Theo landed here at the Enterprise.

JOHN THOMPSON

Weston! Theo! You guys made it!

WESTON

Yeah! The Japs got what they've deserve. For hitting us at Pearl Harbor last year.

BEN THOMPSON

Hey, where's Grenat?

THEO

He's dead, Ben. He's a tail gunner of Torpedo Squadron 6.

JOHN THOMPSON

Oh, no!

BEN THOMPSON

He's dead?

JOHN THOMPSON

So that means-

BEN THOMPSON

Grenat!

JOHN THOMPSON

That Jap bastard took out Grenat? No way!

DEWITT W. SHUMWAY

Grenat tried to shoot down the Japanese Zeros off Lindsey's tail, but he didn't. All the TBDs are shot down.

WESTON

Not all of them. Only four TBDs made it back to the USS $\mathit{Enterprise}$.

INT. IJN HIRYU - CAPTAIN'S BRIDGE - DAY

SUPER: "5:00 PM."

Captain Kaku gives the report to Admiral Yamaguchi.

TOMEO KAKU

(speaking in Japanese) Admiral, our pilots successfully sank one of the American carriers.

TAMON YAMAGUCHI

(speaking in Japanese) It's a pity that Admiral Nagumo disobeys Admiral Yamamoto's orders. Send our fighters to defend our CAP.

Before Captain Kaku said anything to Admiral Yamaguchi, they spot the SBDs coming towards them.

TOMEO KAKU

(speaking in Japanese) Enemy
aircraft, incoming!

Admiral Yamaguchi looks through the binoculars and spots a squadron of SBDs diving towards the last Japanese Carrier.

TAMON YAMAGUCHI

(speaking in Japanese) Shoot them down!

INT. IJN HIRYU - ANTI-AIRCRAFT STATION - DAY

The Japanese sailors open fire at the SBDs with anti-aircraft guns. Flaks burst all around the SBDs, but only four bombs hit the bow of *Hiryu*.

DEWITT W. SHUMWAY

(on radio) Woohoo! This is for Pearl Harbor, you motherfucker!

EXT. USS ENTERPRISE - FLIGHT DECK - SUNSET

The SBDs land on the carrier. The Thompson Brothers celebrate their victory.

BEN THOMPSON

We did it, Bro! We sank all four Jap Carriers!

JOHN THOMPSON

Yeah! Let's celebrate our first victory at the Pacific.

RICHARD JACCARD

We all did it.

BEN THOMPSON

Richard! Dusty! Congratulations on your first victory!

NORMAN KLEISS

Thank you, guys!

JOHN THOMPSON

Where's Dick?

RICHARD JACCARD

He's ill, John. He won't fly again, but you and your brother will.

BEN THOMPSON

Thank you, Richard. From now on, we'll stay together as a family.

NORMAN KLEISS

I wouldn't say that if I were you. There are two Jap carriers left to deal with.

BEN THOMPSON

Say what?

JOHN THOMPSON
