


















STORY

'Land Angels' is a tense and moving portrayal of the devastation that medical diagnosis can have on an entire family. It's emotionally resonant and the seeds of a touching drama are evident through all acts of the film.

This story is based on true events that happened to my husband and I. Due to privacy, I have blurred out our faces to protect his and my children's identity.

ANNA – Wife and mother

Anna is a likeable protagonist who it is easy to empathise with. Her struggle to maintain strength while grappling with fear and exhaustion is portrayed through both quiet moments and more dramatic confrontations. We feel every weight placed upon her shoulders - from managing Marc's care to navigating family dynamics to protecting her children's emotional well-being. What's particularly compelling is how her relationship with Zelda evolves from simple pet ownership into a profound spiritual connection. This clearly offers her strength when human support systems fall short. This threading of faith and guardianship through Anna's arc gives the story a unique spiritual dimension without becoming heavy-handed. Anna feels complex and layered and her narration really helps immerse the viewer in a world that she's desperately trying to hold together.









Rhonda – Marc's Mother

Rhonda is the story's primary human antagonist. Though much of the antagonism in the script is provided by Marc's medical issues, Rhonda provides some interesting conflict of her own. The tensions between her and Anna are mined to great effect. Rhonda embodies the complicated nature of in-law relationships, especially during a crisis. Her overbearing behaviour stems from genuine love and fear for her son, even as it clashes with Anna's approach. The gradual shift in their relationship, as both women learn to acknowledge each other's place in Marc's life, is one of the most nuanced aspects.









Marc – Father, Husband, Son

Marc is a man in his early 40s with a once-vibrant energy that life has recently been tested. His tall frame still carries the remnants of his younger self's athleticism. His eyes reflect both a weariness and an unyielding warmth, a man trying to keep his family together even as his own body betrays him.

A loving father and devoted husband, Marc has always been the rock of his family, someone his children look up to for guidance and strength. However, his recent heart attack has left him grappling with his mortality and the fear of not being there for his family when they need him.

Marc's relationship with his wife is loving but strained under the weight of their situation. He's caught between his wife's frustrations and his mother-in-law's well-meaning but often misplaced interventions.

Marc is a man of quiet resilience. His journey is one of rediscovering strength - not just physical strength but the strength to navigate his role as a father, husband, and son in a time of profound vulnerability.







Henry and Joe

Henry (8) and Joe (6) are two young brothers navigating the emotional upheaval in their family.

Henry, mature beyond his years, feels an urgent responsibility to step into his dad's role, trying to protect his younger brother and support his crumbling mother. His determination to hold everything together belies his tender age.

Joe, the quieter of the two, copes by withdrawing into silence. His emotions remain bottled up until they inevitably overflow in a vulnerable moment with his dad. Together, the brothers' contrasting ways of processing the chaos around them create a poignant and heartfelt dynamic.







My name is Lauren, and I'm a writer from a seaside suburb of Brisbane, Australia. I love exploring with my family, traveling, trying new things, laughing out loud, and being outdoors. I started writing after a horrid year in 2020. This screenplay made it into the Quarterfinals in the New Voices in Animation Screenplay awards through Stage 32. My script 'Land Angels' received an Honourable Mention in the New York Script Awards 2024 and gained a place as a Quarter Finalist in the Los Angeles International Screenplay Awards 2025.
