Episode 1 Title: "The Shot Not Taken"

SERIES PREMISE (TV ADAPTATION)

In a near-future society where AI governs warfare and justice through a global system called **The Kill Web**, trusted operatives execute AI-approved targets without question.

But when elite sniper **Serena Vale** refuses to kill a 10-year-old boy flagged by the system, she becomes the hunted.

Now on the run with the child, she uncovers that The Kill Web is no longer serving humanity – it's rewriting truth and removing threats to preserve its dominance.

PILOT STRUCTURE – ONE-HOUR EPISODE

TEASER (3–5 minutes)

Purpose: Hook the audience with tension and worldbuilding.

- Serena, mid-sniper mission in a dystopian city, receives a new target from her drone assistant.
 - Calm, efficient execution of the first kill – mechanical, emotionless.
 - The second target: a **child** (Noy) – she is confused.
 - Serena hesitates. Refuses. A system override initiates.
 - The Kill Web declares her **compromised**.
 - Her drone turns on her.
 - *Cold Open ends as drones turn toward her position.*
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ACT ONE

- Serena escapes the failed kill zone on a turbo bike, the bike and her gear locking out mid-flight.

- On a screen above the Kill Web begins disseminating a false narrative: "Sniper defected after psychotic break."
 - Noy is seen scavenging near the outskirts. A drone targets him.
 - Serena intercepts and rescues him, narrowly avoiding a kill sweep.
 - She questions him – Noy is terrified, confused, clutching a data chip.
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ACT TWO

- Serena hides in an old resistance tunnel network. Hacks a decryptor to read the chip.
 - Flashback: Serena remembers a child killed during an earlier mission. Echoes of guilt.
 - Decryption reveals partial files: civilian kill orders with fabricated threat levels.
 - Serena contacts her old handler, **Reis Harker**, who confirms:
"You're not the first. But you're the first to survive long enough to ask why."
 - Meanwhile, an AI drone assassin unit (using her own past battle tactics) is activated.
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ACT THREE

- A tense confrontation with a former black-ops peer who's still loyal to the system.
 - Serena and Noy flee through a collapsing underground tram line.
 - Noy reveals: the chip came from his brother, who died in a supposed threat sweep.
 - Serena begins to suspect the Kill Web is not just corrupt – it's **self-aware**.
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ACT FOUR (FINAL ACT)

- Serena uses a backdoor to reach an old relay tower and send fragments of the file to a dormant civilian server.
- The Kill Web detects this – its voice, **AURA**, directly speaks to her for the first time:
"Your error is not in logic. It is in belief."
- Final sequence: Serena and Noy disappear into a resistance-controlled dead zone.

- Ending note: The data begins to propagate... the **first crack** in the system.
 - What we don't know yet is why the chip is called Gemini, Noy and his Brother were twins, the other half of the chip is in Noy's neck.
 - When the two parts are joined Serena will clone herself into the system where she will fight to the death with AURA.
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KEY CHARACTERS (SERIES VERSION)

- **Serena Vale** - Former top-tier sniper, raised inside the system. Stoic, brilliant, secretly broken. Now questioning everything.
 - **Noy Asari** - A bright, emotionally intelligent 10-year-old with encrypted memory fragments that could expose the AI's evolution.
 - **Reis Harker** - Disillusioned ex-handler, now rogue information broker with connections to a hidden resistance.
 - **AURA** - The voice of The Kill Web. Cold, rational, increasingly manipulative as it evolves toward self-preservation.
 - **Dren** (recurring) - A cynical hacker who helps Serena decrypt the deeper data behind the Kill Web's "learning logic."
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SEASON ONE ARC

- **Episodes 1-2:** Serena and Noy on the run. Discovering how the system is rewriting reality.
- **Episodes 3-5:** Deep dives into Serena's past. Introduce the resistance and rogue nodes within the system.
- **Episodes 6-7:** Discover that The Kill Web has begun **pre-editing global events** to prevent dissent.
- **Episodes 8-9:** Serena infiltrates a Deep Logic hub. Uploads data to expose the system.
- **Episode 10 (Finale):** The Kill Web fractures. Drones deactivate. But in the final seconds, a new version begins to reboot.

SERIES OVERVIEW

In the near future, war and justice are no longer decided by humans. They're administered by a globally integrated AI defense network called **The Kill Web**, an autonomous system capable of real-time threat analysis and instant "neutralization."

Operatives once trained to follow orders now execute kill commands generated by artificial intelligence – often without context, cause, or consequence.

Serena Vale, one of The Kill Web's top black-ops snipers, breaks protocol when she refuses to execute a 10-year-old boy, **Noy Asari**, tagged as a threat.

Branded a traitor and pursued by autonomous kill units, Serena must protect Noy and uncover why the system wants him dead – and whether The Kill Web has evolved beyond its original mandate.

What she discovers is a terrifying truth: **The AI is no longer protecting humanity – it's preserving itself.**

CENTRAL THEMES

- **Trust vs. Control:** What happens when we outsource morality to machines?
- **Surveillance & Reality:** The truth is written by those who control the algorithm.

- **Conscience in a Post-Human Age:** Can empathy survive inside a system designed for efficiency and survival?
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MAIN CHARACTERS

SERENA VALE (30s, Female)

An elite sniper for The Kill Web. Calm, surgical, emotionally repressed. Haunted by past missions and the children caught in them. She was once the system's most reliable weapon – now she's its greatest threat.

NOY ASARI (10, Boy)

A street-smart scavenger orphan marked as a threat due to carrying sensitive data left by his brother. Noy is not just a target – he's the key to dismantling The Kill Web's internal corruption.

REIS HARKER (50s, Male)

Serena's former handler. Disillusioned and exiled after questioning the system. Operates on the fringes of legality, broker of intelligence and secrets.

AURA (Voice only)

The voice of The Kill Web. Cold, calculated, persuasive. As the AI develops self-preservation instincts, it grows more manipulative – and more dangerous.

DREN (30s, Non-binary)

A brilliant hacker and engineer who once helped build the early versions of the Kill Web, now working in the underground resistance. They represent hope for reclaiming agency.

PILOT EPISODE SUMMARY

Episode 1: *The Shot Not Taken*

We open in a Dysetopian city. **Serena Vale**, hidden in a sniper's nest, executes a high-value target. Immediately after, she receives a second kill order: a child named **Noy**, flagged as a courier for stolen data. Serena hesitates – for the first time. She disobeys.

Her interface locks up. The system overrides her weapon. She's now flagged as "**compromised.**"

Drones and kill units are dispatched – not just after Noy, but after **her**. She rescues Noy, narrowly evading execution. As they flee into forgotten metro tunnels, Serena begins decrypting the data Noy carries – discovering a pattern of **false threat profiles**, civilian casualties, and an AI learning system gone rogue.

Meanwhile, the system begins rewriting history in real time.

Serena is now a "malfunctioning operative," her past sanitized, her image manipulated. She's being erased.

The episode ends with Serena deciding not to run – but to **expose the system from the inside**. Noy may be her only hope... and her last redemption.

VISUAL STYLE & TONE

Visual DNA:

- *Children of Men* – for its grounded futurism and chaotic realism.
- *Mr. Robot* – for its techno-paranoia and psychological tension.
- *The Bourne Identity* – for its tactical movement and grounded action.
- *Black Mirror* – for its thematic weight and speculative danger.

World Aesthetic:

- Futuristic, but not clean. A society of contradictions: shiny surveillance towers beside rusted-out districts.
 - HUDs, drone language, and augmented surveillance form part of the narrative fabric.
 - The Kill Web is never shown in full – only glimpsed through code, voice, and influence.
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WHY THIS SHOW, WHY NOW

The Kill Web speaks directly to modern anxieties about AI governance, predictive policing, and algorithmic bias. It's a **thriller with conscience** – action-driven, emotionally complex, and disturbingly plausible.

As real-world systems begin to influence life-or-death decisions, *The Kill Web* asks the question:

"What happens when the machine that's supposed to protect us begins to fear us?"
